Dear Somerset County Chamber Members,

Many of you have taken advantage of our Chamber Energy program, however, if your business or home is still receiving the utility default rates, now is an ideal time to explore switching and lower your energy spend. National Parks of Western Pennsylvania News Release

National Parks of Western Pennsylvania = visitors, money and jobs for local economy

– A new National Park Service (NPS) report shows that 643,000 visitors in 2010 spent \$28 million in the five national parks in Western Pennsylvania and in communities near the parks. That spending supported 421 jobs in the local area. These numbers are expected to grow significantly as annual visitation to the newly dedicated Flight 93 National Memorial grows to 400,000. The figures also do not include construction spending for the Memorial.

“The people and the business owners in communities near national parks have always known their economic value,” said National Park Service Superintendent Jeff Reinbold, “The sites in western Pennsylvania not only preserve the heritage of our region, but contribute significantly to our local economies and quality of life.”

Most of the spending and jobs nation-wide are related to lodging, food, and beverage service (52 percent) followed by other retail (29 percent), entertainment/amusements (10 percent), gas and local transportation (7 percent) and groceries (2 percent).

The figures are based on \$12 billion of direct spending by 281 million visitors in 394 national parks and nearby

communities and are included in an annual, peer-reviewed, visitor spending analysis conducted by Dr. Daniel Stynes of Michigan State University for the National Park Service.

Across the U.S, local visitor spending added a total of \$31 billion to the national economy and supported more than 258,000 jobs, an increase of \$689 million and 11,500 jobs over 2009.

The report includes information for visitor spending at individual parks and by state. The five sites in western Pennsylvania are Allegheny Portage Railroad National Historic Site, Johnstown Flood National Memorial, Flight 93 National Memorial, Fort Necessity National Battlefield, and Friendship Hill National Historic Site.

Laurel Highlands Trout Trail

Only Alaska has more miles of trout streams than Pennsylvania. The Laurel Highlands, located in the state's highest mountains offer some of the best trout fishing in the east. A 75-mile (north/south) Trout Trail will guide visitors and their families to ten (10) of the best streams from just north of Ligonier, south to Donegal, Confluence, Ohiopyle and the Quebec Wild area. Kickoff will be May 1, 2012 and run all month.

The goals are : 1.) to encourage fly fishermen and their families to experience excellent fishing, but also to enjoy other Laurel Highlands' cultural, natural, recreational, and historical assets along the Laurel Ridge. 2.) to educate residents and visitors about the importance of high quality streams and to provide workshops (for all ages) that demonstrate the year round work that watershed groups, Trout Unlimited Chapters, and state parks/forests do to monitor, evaluate, and improve stream habitat and of course, fly fishing instruction; and 3.) to encourage multi-day visits from other parts of Pennsylvania, but also to

draw visitors from outside of the state as well. Merchants, libraries, cultural groups will be promoting and displaying merchandise that will appeal to this segmented group. Lodging and restaurant partners will be offering overnight packages and special menus.

An exciting Rendezvous will be held at Hidden Valley Resort on Saturday, May 19, 2012 from 4-7p.m. In addition to several informational and demonstration booths, heavy appetizers, and door prizes, attendees will enjoy a program by George Daniel. Daniel has been seen on ESPN and OLN while competing in the Great Outdoor Games, and the Fly Fishing Masters. He logs over 200 days a year on trout waters near and far. The list of national and international medals goes on and on. He was Head Coach of the USA Fly Fishing Team in the 2011 Fly Fishing Championships in Italy. Don't miss George's may presentation. This initiative is being coordinated by LHHC, Linn Run State Park/Forbes State Forest, and Forbes Trail Chapter of Trout Unlimited.
